When I first used and observed the road in the late 1930s, it followed the same route as in 2004 when I last observed it. Attached is a Iron County map showing Red Creek Reservoir Loop Road. To the best of my knowledge and based upon my use of and familiarity with this road and the land it traverses, the location and route of the road are correctly illustrated on the attached map.

3. I am informed that the County also identifies this road according to the road number listed above.

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
5. Throughout the time period from the late 1930s to 2004, I have used the road myself for fishing, hunting, logging, road maintenance and travel in and through the area.

6. Throughout the time period described in the previous paragraph, I have observed vehicles from the general public using the road at various times for livestock operations, recreation, and traveling in and through the area.



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



RED CREEK RESERVOIR LOOP ICO-0009
